About ASER

The Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) is a household survey of children's schooling status and their ability to do basic reading and arithmetic tasks. The first ASER was conducted in 2005 and repeated annually till 2014. In 2016, ASER shifted to a new cycle in which the 'basic' nationwide ASER, across all rural districts of the country, is conducted every alternate year. Since 2014, the 'basic' nationwide ASER has been conducted in 2016, 2018, 2022 and 2024. In addition, the ASER surveyors visit one government school, with the highest enrollment in primary sections, in each sampled village. Information about schools presented in ASER is based on these visits.

The ASER 2024 survey reached 605 districts, 17,997 villages, 352,028 households and 649,491 children. 15,728 schools were also visited in ASER 2024 and the survey was conducted by 25,557 volunteers from 641 partner organisations.

Samagra Shiksha, an overarching program for school education from pre-school to Std XII, was announced in the 2018 union budget. In 2019, Samagra Shiksha, for the first time, included a provision for an annual grant for sports equipment in schools. Under this grant, "every government school will receive a sports grant of Rs. 5,000 for primary schools, Rs. 10,000 for upper primary schools and up to Rs. 25,000 for secondary and senior secondary schools, to procure sports equipment for indoor and outdoor games." In the National Curriculum Framework, published in 2023, physical education is seen as an important curricular area and not just an extracurricular activity. It has its own set of learning standards, content, appropriate pedagogies, and assessments.

ASER data can be used to understand the provision of physical education infrastructure in government schools in rural India, at both the state and national levels. ASER 2024 includes information on whether dedicated time and teachers are available for physical education in government schools. ASER also records availability of basic infrastructure for physical education, like playgrounds and sports equipment.







In each sampled school, there could be a physical education teacher appointed specifically to teach physical education, or if a dedicated teacher is not available another subject teacher could be conducting the physical education class, or the school could have no teacher for physical education. For each state, these three categories are mutually exclusive and add up to 100%. In order to understand the state-wise proportion of schools with no physical education teachers, the sum of the proportions of separate teacher or any other teacher can be subtracted from 100. For e.g., in 2024, at the national level, 16.5% schools had a separate physical education teacher, and in 59.6% schools another teacher was taking the physical education class. Therefore, 23.9% (=100-16.5-59.6) schools reported having no teacher for physical education.

The proportion of schools with no PE teachers has declined between 2018 to 2024. However, almost 1 in 4 schools still did not have a PE teacher in 2024.




