About ASER

The Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) is a household survey of children's schooling status and their basic reading and arithmetic skills. It has been facilitated by Pratham every year from 2005-2014, and then every alternate year since 2016 (except 2020). ASER is carried out by volunteers from a local organisation in each district.

ASER 2024 reached 605 districts, 17,997 villages, 352,028 households, and 649,491 children in the age group of 3-16. 614 partners and 25,557 volunteers participated in this effort.



1. Information on attendance is based on the data collected from government schools.

2. Data for Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu, and Puducherry have not been presented in this report due to insufficient sample size.

3. Andhra Pradesh was bifurcated into Telangana and Andhra Pradesh in 2014. As a result, the sample frames of Census 2011 do not have the new state divisions. Of the 22 districts in undivided Andhra Pradesh, 9 rural districts are located in Telangana and the remaining 13 districts are located in Andhra Pradesh. ASER estimates for the two states are based on this separation of districts.

4. Estimates for the Union Territories of Ladakh and Jammu and Kashmir have been presented in a combined form for comparability with ASER estimates of previous years.

5. ASER 2024 was not conducted in Goa and Manipur, and data for schools has not been presented for Tripura as schools were not surveyed due to logistical constraints.
